
Children have been involved in a number of other life skill activities which include craft making, gardening and cooking which they have doing with the guidance of staff

Yielding from the Garden







After the report obtained that both is parents had separated and through the probation he was referred to CSU for care and protection.



Mubiru Frank alias Abdul aged 14 years was joined CSU on 13 June, 2021 through the Office of the district probation after he was left helpless when his parents got misunderstandings.



Tragedies



On the 3rd February 2021, a dark cloud covered CSU when on of our own Abimanyi Meshach succumbed to severe pneumonia and died on arrival to Mulago referral hospital

And just recent in June, CSU was hit again with another huge tragedy when one of the longest serving Board Member and a friend of CSU a one Onesmus Ssendagire succumbed to Covid-19.

Support is Needed

One of the Children's Latrines has been declared a high risk facility for the children after it developed cracks and at the verge of collapsing. Urgent support is needed to construct a new one without delay as the children mostly the girls have to walk longer distance to another alternative latrine. The proposal has already been drafted on the actual amount required of approximately UGX 12,000,000
